## Ease Your Mind Quickly with *RafflesHospital's* Latest Breast Examination Technology

In conjunction with Breast Cancer Awareness Month, Raffles Hospital will be introducing digital breast tomosynthesis (DBT), a breakthrough 3D imaging technology which allows the easier distinguishing of harmless breast tissue from tumours.

This means fewer callbacks and less of an anxious wait for a second or even third round of results for patients.

DBT has seen use in other parts of the world, such as Brazil, Thailand, Belgium and France, from as early as 2009. This past March also saw the first US clinical DBT patient.

Dr Felicia Tan, Specialist in General Surgery & Consultant, Raffles Surgery Centre is excited about the prospects DBT brings, "This brings a new level of convenience and assurance for patients. Having to wait for the results of another test is usually an agonising experience and being able to remove this is a boost for the physical and mental well-being of patients."

Unlike conventional 2D mammograms, DBT takes images of the breast from multiple angles resulting in a 3D representation. This additional diagnostic dimension gives doctors insight into abnormalities such as lesion depths and tumour volumes, making detection an easier and more accurate affair.

Raffles Hospital's DBT service is also able to capture both 2D and 3D images, saving more time and allowing doctors to compare and contrast both sets of results.

The procedure for DBT is almost similar to a conventional mammogram. The machine now moves around the breast capturing images from multiple angles instead of being stationary.

DBT is also safe for use on patients. Radiation doses produced from DBT falls under the Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) regulated limit for mammography and no risk from the extra minimal radiation has ever been proven.

Furthermore, DBT screenings will only be available to patients via referral or if doctors feel there is a need for more detail for diagnoses. Patients who suspect they require DBT should first seek a doctor's advice.

DBT screenings at Raffles Hospital will cost around \$70 a breast.
